

If you have not registered and voted by mail or absentee, you still have an opportunity to come out to the drive-thru meeting and do so. Our drive-thru meeting will be held at the office facility on

Thursday, August 1st. You can drive-thru to register and vote from 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. and if you would like you can attend the in-person business meeting. It will be held promptly at 6:00 p.m. in our warehouse. The same reports that will be given at the business meeting were printed in last month's Rural Missouri.

You will see that there is a listing of names in this month's edition. These individuals or businesses have unclaimed capital credits with us, and we have no forwarding addresses for them. Checks were mailed back to us undeliverable. If you can help us locate any of these past members, please give us a call today. We would appreciate your help in getting the money to these past members. I know many of you are wondering what happens to that money if we cannot locate those members in a timely manner. It is in our by-laws that unclaimed capital credits after 3 years revert to the cooperative and must be used for nonprofit charitable or educational purposes, which allows us to fund things such as our scholarship program, Youth Tour, CY-CLE, and the programs we use to educate members, with no affect on the current members. That's right when you see us send youth on Youth Tour, it does not affect your electric bill at all. If unclaimed capital credits were not used in this manner they would have to be sent to the state and the cooperative would see no benefit at all from those monies. Of course, we would rather return the money to the actual past member that is owed to if we can, but sometimes that is just not possible. Please go through this list and see if you know anyone, or even know a member of their family and help us

get this money in the hands of the people it is owed to.

Speaking of Youth Tour, we are very proud of our delegates this year. There is an article included in this issue regarding those delegates and what the trip was all about. We were please to announce the winners of the Lewis County REC Scholarships. Each year we give out 6-\$1000 scholarships to graduating seniors. This year's recipients are Trey Fryer -Canton, Kinsey Biggerstaff - Canton, Seth LaFrenz -Wyaconda, Drew Holstead - Canton, Lane James - Baring, and Savanna Schrage - Edina. We are proud to help these fine young people further their education.

One hundred and two high school students participated in Missouri's 61st annual Missouri Electric Youth Tour to Washington, D.C., June 14-20. Local delegates were Remington May (Lewis County C-1), Jasmine James (Clark County R-1), Terry Ogden (Knox County R-1) and Avery Uhlmeyer (Canton R-V). They were sponsored by Lewis County REC

provides an action-filled week for
high school students, offering them
opportunities to learn firsthand
what it is like to be involved in
politics, leadership positions,
community service and today's
pressing issues.

"The Youth Tour is the highlight of the summer for many students and we're proud to send our best and brightest to our nation's capital to participate," said Chris Massman, vice president of Member Services for the Association of Missouri Electric Cooperatives. Massman also said, "Each of these delegates will meet someone or see something that inspires them, and in some cases will create a path to their future career."

Highlights of the trip include the Missouri delegates visiting with




representatives from their congressional districts, touring monuments, the Smithsonian Institution's museums, Arlington National Cemetery and the International Spy Museum. The group also took a sightseeing and dance cruise on the Potomac River one evening with the delegations from five other states.

Other events of the week included participation in the Electric Youth Day, during which a special program coordinated by the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association brought together over 2,000 Youth Tour delegates from across the United States. The delegates enjoyed featured speeches by government leaders and motivational speakers,

such as Mike Schlappi, an inspiring four-time Paralympic medalist and two-time world wheelchair basketball champion.

Since 1964, the nation's cooperative electric utilities have sponsored more than 58,000 high school juniors and seniors for visits to their U.S. congressional delegations, energy and grassroots government education sessions and sightseeing in Washington. THE POWER OF MISSOURI'S ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE SYSTEM

Your electricity flows through a three-tiered system of electric cooperatives. The entire system benefits from the economy of scale and, since each tier can react quickly to changes, the overall competitiveness of the system is improved. This creates affordable and reliable electricity for you.



The electricity is delivered directly to you, as a member of one of Missouri's 40 distribution cooperatives.



That power is transmitted throughout Missouri by six transmission cooperatives.



Associated Electric Cooperative Inc. generates power for Missouri members from a mix natural gas, coal, hydropower and wind.
